The current is God! We have the power to allow the current to flow through us and thus to generate the light of the world: JESUS or to refuse to be used and, thus, allow the darkness to spread."

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


esus said to His disciples: "Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation" (Mark 16:15). And for those of you who are accustomed to the way things are here at Kingdom Revelator, you know what word is up next - evangelisation. There was a time when I would simultaneously shudder and cringe at that very word. 

Jacob's Final Blessing

We're going to explore the story of Jacob (the grandson of Abraham). Now Jacob had twelve sons and four wives. After a lot of family problems, slavery, prison and some crazy dreams, the family moved from Canaan to Egypt. Towards the end of the Book of Genesis, at the deathbed of Jacob he is blessing each of his sons one by one.

Now, when he gets to his fourth son, Judah, he seems to bless him in a different way than the others. He says, "Judah, your brothers shall praise you; your hand will be on the neck of your enemies; your father's sons shall bow down before you. Judah is a lion's whelp; from the prey, my son, you have gone up. He crouches down, he stretches like a lion, like a lioness - who dares rouse him up? The scepter shall not depart from Judah, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, until obedience comes to him; and the obedience of his people is his. Binding his foal to the vine and his donkey's colt in

the choice vine, he washes his garments in wine and his robe in the blood of grapes; his eyes are darker than wine, and his teeth whiter than milk" (Genesis 49:8-12).

What is He on About?

In the first Book of Samuel, we see the fulfillment of these prophecies. When Jacob talks about the 'scepter', he gives a clear image of a king's scepter with which he rules. The first king from the line of David is King David (remember the story of David and Goliath from 1 Samuel 17).

Now, ever since David, there had



always been a direct descendant who reigned as king (until the Exile to Babylon in around 598 BC. This can be found in 2 Kings 25 & 2 Chronicles 36:15-21). After the exile, the line of kings is forgo tten about, until Jesus appears on the scene, who is of the descent of David, Judah and Abraham. And, as we all know, Jesus is our king who reigns for eternity in heaven.

Balaam's Prophecy

Another prophecy is that of a false prop het named Balaam. The background to this story is as follows: the people of Israel, who had just been freed from the Egyptians, formed a covenant with God and are on their way to the promised land.

On the way, they start to argue with God and

Moses (the one who brought them out of Egypt), saying that they were better off in Egypt (this can be found in the Book of Numbers). Soon, they arrive at the city of Moab and camp outside it (remember, they're still quarrelling).

Now in the city, the King of Moab, King Balak, knows that the Israelites have camped outside his city - and he is terrified! He and his people have heard by now of what the God of Israel is capable of. He parted the Red Sea, destroyed the Egyptian army, annihilated some other kingdoms on the way and is probably going to destroy Moab as well. He is petrified, hence decides to summon divine help rather than prepare for war. He calls for this false prophet, Balaam (check out Numbers 22).

Balak asks Balaam to curse Israel for him. So Balaam goes to the top of the mountain, opens his mouth and tries to curse Israel. But when he opens his mouth, he can only utter blessings upon them. Four times he blesses

them and the third time, he says, "He crouched, he lay down like a lion, and like a lioness: who will rouse him up?" (Numbers 24:9). WOAH! That's the exact same thing that Jacob said to Judah. Yet again, we're told that a lion will arise from Jacob (and we already know that Jesus is the lion of the tribe of Judah). And in his fourth oracle (prophecy), he says even more! "I see him, but not now; I behold him,

but not near - a star shall come out of Jacob, and a scepter shall rise out of Israel; it shall crush the borderlands of Moab, and the territory of all the Shethites" (Numbers 24:17).

The Link Starts to Appear

Now, the part about the star is important. When we read Matthew 2:2, we find some wise men looking for Jesus, saying that they "had seen his star in the East and have come to worship him." This is further implied

when we look at the Book of the prophet Micah: "...O Bethlehem ...from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel" (Micah 5:2). Now, Bethlehem is a city in... Judah! And it's actually called 'The City of David'. Now the pieces are coming together. Jesus, though raised in Nazareth, was born in Bethlehem, which is what Micah foretold. And Balaam even mentioned the scepter that Jacob spoke about! Then he talked about crushing Moab.

Do not weep. See, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has conquered.

Revelation 5:5

This is an echo of the promise made by God to Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden. Another word for 'Borderlands' is forehead. And we already know that God had said that He will send someone to crush the head of the serpent. And so, when we look at the prophecies altogether, they point to the coming of someone who is going to rid the world of evil by becoming a king and dying for us. And all this was fulfilled in Jesus Christ.

Those who pray the rosary regularly obtain many graces, which help them to pass through the narrow gate that leads to heaven. The rosary is a powerful weapon that ward helps to off temptations. It purifies our souls, washes away our sins and helps us conquer our vices. Our Lady desires to attain the virtue of purity for all those who pray the rosarv regularly. St Padre Pio instructed his spiritual children, "Abandon yourself in the hands of Mary. She will take care of you." She always leads us to her Son, and presents our needs before Him. 

CONFUSION IN FAITH

It's normal to have doubts in our faith - a Sehion youth minister shares his thoughts.

remember attending a conference once and coming back home with a new zeal for the Lord. There was an eagerness within me and it felt as though a fire had been lit inside my heart. I can recall how consistent and good my prayer life was; I could read the Bible, pray the rosary and attend Holy Mass without losing focus. It is precisely at this time of feeling spiritually uplifted that all of a sudden, a question somebody asks me or a passing thought causes me to doubt. Am I being delusional in believing in God? Is that bread, once consecrated, really Jesus? Is God actually alive or am I fooling myself?

From the Beginning

is important to understand that e devil does not want us to row closer to Christ. This is because the moment we start trusting in Jesus and solely relying on Him, the devil no longer has any influence over us. Therefore, the devil will craftily plant doubts in our minds just as he tricked Eve into thinking that by eating the fruit, she would be able to discern between good and evil (Genesis 3:5). In fact Eve, being made in the image of God, already knew what was right and wrong because she knew that it was wrong to eat from the tree that God had forbidden (Genesis 3:3). The devil however, planted a seed of doubt in her head that bloomed and she was not only able to convince herself, but Adam too, that God had not granted them the ability to distinguish between good and evil. This was

nothing but a trick which finally

led them to sin.

Overthinking

Many of us often complain about the Holy Bible and how challenging it can be to believe what is written in it. This is because we attempt to perceive God and His divine Word with our intellect. The problem is that though we want to have faith, we are unwilling to surrender our intellect and minds to God who is the source and fountain of all wisdom (Proverb 2:6). Sometimes, we are as St Paul says, "darkened in their understanding, alienated from the life of God because of their ignorance and hardness of heart." (Ephesians 4:18) Trying to confine God to our own understanding is a natural tendency but this simply leads to a state where our minds become veiled, and we are unable to understand God (2 Corinthians 3:14).

In a way, confusion and struggles with faith is a blessing in disguise because God is nudging us to move from overthinking with our brains to thinking with our hearts. Sometimes, when doubts arise, we have to approach Jesus and make an act of faith by saying "I trust you Jesus". St Therese of Lisieux, (also known as the 'Little Flower') one of the most loved saints, underwent a huge crisis of faith during her life. Just before she died, the Little Flower told her Mother Superior that the worst kind of atheistic arguments had entered her mind about how sooner or later, science would be able to explain everything and so Christianity would fail. She struggled believing in heaven and felt as if God had left her. St Therese fought this temptation of being drawn into desperation by making frequent acts of faith. St Therese wrote "while I do not have the joy of faith, I am trying I have always found that these moments of doubts are actually pathways to grace in my

doubts are actually pathways to grace in my life. These are the moments when I force myself to say "I trust in God's Word and if Jesus said it. I must believe it". Though at first it seems ludicrous and silly, this small act of faith in God's Word has lifted many veils that prevented me from seeing the truth. God's wisdom advises each one of us, "reflect you what you have been commanded, for what is hidden is not your concern" (Sirach 3:22). It is not our concern because everything will be revealed to us by Jesus Himself. Remember that the apostles too had their doubts and indeed, when Jesus opened their minds, they said "now we know that you know all things, and do not need to have anyone question you; by this we believe

to carry out its works at least. I believe that I have made more acts of faith in this past year than all through my whole life". Though this saint struggled with her faith, she ended it with a profound mystical experience and now is acknowledged as a Doctor of the Church. Once, St Therese's nurse found her awake after midnight, unable to sleep. The nurse asked what she said to God during the long, wakeful hours. St Therese replied, "I do not say anything, Sister, I just love Him."

Trusting God

Like The Little Flower, in our doubts, we have to live by faith alone. St Paul says in the Bible, "we walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7). I have always found that these moments of that you came from God" (John 16:30). God puts us through these tough times to make us solely reliant on Him, and to walk with Him blindly by placing our trust in Him.

One way to always think about it is that God is giving us a special grace to be united with Him. Just as a blind person requires someone to guide them across the road in busy traffic, these crises of faith are a way of God, granting us a unique grace to depend on Him alone. It is an opportunity for us to rely on Him to guide and navigate us through our darkness. In this way, we participate uniquely in those moments of Jesus at the garden of Gethsemane and on the cross where there was nothing but silence from His Father.

















Joyson Joboy from Birmingham, UK explains how our sufferings can be turned to joy when we unite it to the sufferings of Christ.

"For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathise with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need" (Hebrews 4:15-16).

St Paul of the Cross was an Italian Mystic and founder of the Passionist Order. Many of his quotes have a moving power to assist us when we go through storms in life. He explains how we can turn setbacks into sweetness; we need not wait until the storm is over, but while we endure it. we can find sweetness in it. Hebrews 4:15-16 affirms that we have a God who experienced first-hand the emotions, tests and sufferings that we ourselves experience in life. He emptied His Divine Nature, became man and even faced temptation just like the rest of us. By His own example, Jesus shows us that we too can resist temptations (through His grace), strengthen our will and gain greater control over our passions. He gives us hope and tells us over and over again not to despair. He promises to be with us, and His nearness turns our sufferings into sweetness.

The Passion of Christ

The reason why we feel burdened by our struggles, pains

or sufferings, is because we either don't realise that God is allpowerful or we haven't completely submitted our lives to Him. We often strive to overcome the suffering by relying on our own abilities. At the time of our Baptism, we were washed with living water, but as

we go through life, our soul becomes stained from our sins. The Lord asks us to deposit these impurities into the sea of sorrows which He accepted for our sake, His passion. St Paul reminds us that His passion is an ocean of love. When we offer ourselves completely to the Lord, He will teach us to fish in that ocean. In other words, we will gain victory over our sufferings. We can dive into its depths without harm. St Paul urges us to often look at the

Crucifix, simply gaze at it, and whisper in our heart, "there are centred all my hopes". By doing this often, we can more easily persevere in our struggles. Simply put, when sufferings come our way, we must maintain a welcoming attitude: "I welcome you by setting my hope and trust in the mercy of God and the merits of my Redeemer."

Let Christ Live in You

According to St. Paul, the best way to find sweetness in pain is to entrust ourselves completely to the Lord's care. When we do this, at every moment, God will be present in our mind and wherever we go, we will be accompanied by His presence. When temptations arise. God watches over us and strengthens us to defeat them. The Lord uses the little sufferings that come our way to make our will stronger. He is alive and faithfully guards those who place their trust in Him. We think with our human logic, which can never give us adequate solutions. When we doubt, the still water becomes troubled waters, in which the devil can cast his lines. So be at peace when trials come our way; even when sufferings increase, focus always on doing the Lord's will so that we can discover and enjoy sweetness of the pain.

Paradise is Calling

Our salvation is in the precious blood of our Lord and at the foot

of the Cross. This means that without pain, we cannot gain paradise. St Paul says that the Lord never gives us a cross that is too heavy for us to bear. He gives us the strength to persevere through trials and bear our personal cross. At the end, He rewards us with eternal life which was purchased for us by His precious blood. Imagine there is a garden, which transfigures our sufferings into flowers. For every suffering we endure, we will see beautiful flowers adorning that garden. The bigger the trial we face, the more beautiful our garden will be. By the virtue of patience, we can joyfully accept all sufferings

that come our way and offer them to Jesus as a bouquet of flowers, picked from our garden of sufferings. When we grow weary, nature itself assures us that after the bitterness of winter, the beauty of spring will come once more. Let us then maintain a life of love, praise and glorify God in every circumstance. Miseries are unavoidable in this life, but remember that they prepare our soul to receive the riches of heaven. When we look at life from this perspective, we will ask the Lord to send us sufferings, rather than complain about them. In every suffering, pain and trial, the intention of God's fatherly love is the salvation of our soul. \mathfrak{M}

ST CLELIA BARBIERI

Patron of Catechists & People ridiculed for their piety





Sharlet Francis Xavier shares the story of a young Italian saint, who is the youngest founder of a religious community in the history of the Church.

Early Life

Clelia Barbieri was born to Giacinta Nannetti and Giuseppe Barbieri in an Italian village called Budrie, in the Archdiocese of Bologna. Her father Giuseppe came from a very poor but committed and faithful Christian family. Giacinta on the other hand, belonged to a rich but pious family. After their marriage, they lived in a humble cottage owned by Barbieri's family who were poor hemp workers. Born on February 13, 1847, Clelia was baptized on the same day with the name Clelia Rachele Maria. The devoted mother, Giacinta, taught Clelia and her sister about the love of Christ and the values of Christian faith early on in their lives which placed the deep desire for sanctity in Clelia's tender heart. One day she asked, "Mother, how can I become a saint?"

In the meantime, Clelia learned the art of sewing, spinning and weaving hemp which was considered the most important work of the village. At the age of eight, Clelia lost her father who became the victim of a cholera epidemic. However, with the generosity of her uncle, the family moved into a house near the parish church. Clelia grew in spirituality during this time and her life became more saintly. She spent all her time either at home weaving and sewing or in church praying and meditating. Clelia was also given first Holy Communion at the age of eleven, due to her unusual catechistic preparation and burning desire to receive the Eucharistic Lord. On this special day, she made a decision concerning her vocation and resolved to become a bride of Christ.


Mystical Experience

Later on, Clelia had her first mystical experience which caused her to feel deep repentance for her own sins and those of the whole world. She began experiencing the agony and suffering of the Crucified Christ and our Lady of Sorrows for the sanctification of souls. From the day of her First Communion, the crucifix and Our Lady of Sorrows

continually inspired her to build her life upon prayer and good works. Clelia imitated Christ and dedicated herself to the service of others through charity and poverty. She practiced selfdenial and rejoiced in the inner communion she had with her Spouse. Before the Blessed Sacrament, Clelia was still and rapt in prayer; at home, she was the companion of and model for her fellow working girls. She worked with great joy, praying and thinking of God unceasingly. At other times, she would speak

proposed the idea of a community devoted to an apostolic and contemplative way of life. This was to be a life of service centred Eucharist. Daily Communion would equip them with the necessary strength to teach catechism to the farmers and labourers of the area.

In 1868, Clelia and her young friends moved into the so-called "teacher's house" where The Christian Catechism Workers used to meet. This was the humble beginning of Clelia Barbieri's religious family which



of Him to her companions. In all and through all, she was immersed in the love of Christ.

Establishina a New Order

At the age of fourteen, Clelia ioined 'The Christian Catechism Workers' of the village and was admitted as an assistant teacher. Soon after, her surprising talents became so evident that she was elected as the leader of the group. A few years later, a group of young women nominated Clelia as their leader and

later became known as Suore Minime dell'Addolorata (Sisters Minims of Our Lady of Sorrows). It was not easy for a teenager to gather and lead a group of faithful. However, she was assisted by God's providence and filled with divine wisdom. The small group was inspired and strengthened by Clelia's physical and mental sufferings in her darkest hours and in the absurd humiliations she had to endure. So much so that by the age of twenty-two, Clelia was called 'mother' by her companions.

Her Prophecy

Two years after establishing the order, the young saint died on July 13, 1870 from tuberculosis. Before departing, Clelia prophesied to the sister at her bedside, "I'm leaving, but I'll never abandon you. When in that Alfalfa field next to the church there will be a new community house, I will no longer be with you ... You will grow in number, and you will expand over plains and mountains to work in the vineyard of the Lord. The day will come when here at Budrie many

will arrive with carriages and horses". She added, "I'm going to heaven and all those who will die in our community will enjoy eternal life. I shall remain with you always and never abandon you". Clelia's prophecy has been fulfilled and on the first anniversary of her death, her presence in the community was recognised at the time of community prayer when a heavenly voice singing and praying was heard. Since then, the communities in Italy, India and Tanzania have testified to hearing St Clelia's voice in their local language at the time of prayer and spiritual reading.

Today, following in Clelia's footsteps, the sisters of Suore Minime dell'Addolorata zealously continue their great work of service to all those in need. Their number has now spread to over thirty-five community houses. Being only twenty-three at the time of her death, Clelia Barbieri is the youngest founder of a religious community in the history of the Church. She was canonised on April 9, 1989 by Pope John Paul II and her feast day is July 13th.

all these sufferings? I began desperately to seek happiness elsewhere - the happiness that the world offered. I wanted to feel accepted and welcomed. I tried to please all my friends and joined them in everything they did; all that they called "joy of one's life". However, each time I returned feeling emptier inside. I thought that giving in to the desires of my body would make me feel wanted and heal my inner wounds, so I did that too. But on the contrary, I felt heartbroken and so much so, that I eventually lost the desire to live. Through the lack of prayer, I grew cold and hit rock bottom. With all the bad habits that had enslaved me. and my broken relationship with my parents, my life

became a burden.

As my disobedience in the house worsened, I caused much pain and heartache to my parents. They prayed fervently for me. Eventually, they forced me to attend a one day retreat in Columbus, Ohio. I went angrily, without expecting anything to change. I believed that the God I had heard about all my life was purely a fantasy. However, during the deliverance prayers towards the end of the retreat, the Lord gave me a strong conviction through the Word of God I heard that day. I experienced Jesus in a radical way for the first time in my life and the Word of God touched me in a way it never had before! After listening to the Scriptures, I realised it was time for me to make a decision – I must either shut out the Scripture from my life, or I must turn over a new leaf and start a new life, as a new creation in Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17). By His grace, I allowed Jesus to heal and mend my broken heart. During the deliverance prayers, I surrendered all my worries and pains to Him for the first time in my life. During the laying on of hands, the Lord poured out His limitless Spirit (John 3:34) upon me, delivering me from all my addictions and pains. God also healed my relationship with my parents (Psalms 50:15). The next day when I got back home, I ran to my parents, gave them a huge hug and cried

close to my heart is John 14:27, "I do not give as the world gives."

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The world gives false happiness that leaves us empty. But our Lord gives

only the best to His children, to those who cling to Him (Matthew 7:11). He is faithful even when we are not, and loves us in spite of our shortcomings (2 Timothy 2:13). I found Jesus when I was at the lowest point in my life. Remember, Jesus doesn't look for your perfections but He seeks the sinners and the broken hearted and delights in them! (Luke 5:32) (Psalms 51:17) Romans 8:39 also reassures us, "Nor height, nor depth, nor anything in all creation can separate us from the love of Christ." Never think you are too far gone, or too deep in sin to turn back. The Lord is bigger than any of your sins. He will give you the courage to walk out of your shame for only He can offer hope and healing for your brokenness.

It was almost three years ago that I attended the lifechanging retreat. That day I asked God to help me start a new chapter in my life, so that I could lead a life pleasing to Him. Today, I stand as a witness for Christ as He continues to pour out His grace on me and helps me to walk in this journey towards Him. I can confidently say that I have been saved by grace (2 Corinthians 12:9) (Ephesians 2:8). When we feel empty inside, we simply need to turn to Him with outstretched arms to receive His everlasting love. So run to Him now! \mathbb{Q}

In the new exhortation, Pope Francis emphasized that the following of Christ—the path to holiness—is "a way of life," not an intellectual exercise. An apostolic

exhortation is usually considered the second-highest form of papal teaching, after an encyclical letter.

IDENTICAL TWINS CELEBRATE 60 YEARS AS PRIESTS

Sydney: 86 year-old identical twins, Fr Patrick and Fr John O'Neill are celebrating 60 years of ordination as Catholic priests. The twins were ordained as Redemptorist priests on 16th March 1958 in Victoria, Australia. Over the ensuing decades, the priests went separate ways doing mission work in parishes all around Australia and Africa. Celebrating their Diamond Jubilee on 16th March, Fr Patrick and Fr John

TEXAS IS HOME TO THE WORLD'S SMALLEST **CATHOLIC CHURCH**



Texas: St Martin's Catholic Church in Warrenton, which is 12 foot by 16 foot has barely enough room for six rows of pews to seat 20 people. According to history, parishioners built the little church using leftovers salvaged from dismantling a larger

church by the same name on the premises. Holy Mass is celebrated once a month for all the intentions left at the altar.

CHINA BANS ONLINE BIBLE SALES

Beijing: As online bookstores in China have pulled the Bible off their shelves, China's seventy million Christians are finding it harder to get a copy of the Holy Bible. China has always controlled the sale of Bibles - only allowing it to be distributed and printed by state-sanctioned churches - but in recent years, it had been available to buy online. As of April, searches for Chinese Bibles on major e-commerce websites including Alibaba's Taobao, JD.com and Amazon China have been to no avail.

CATHOLIC PRIEST WAS KILLED WHILE HEARING **CONFESSIONS**

Mexico: A Catholic priest. Juan Miguel Contreras Garcia was shot dead in the state of Jalisco on April



20th, the second priest murdered within one week in the country. The 33-year-old priest was performing the sacrament of penance after the celebration of Holy Mass, when he was attacked in his parish sacristy. Twenty three priests have been killed in Mexico since 2012.

ISLAMIC UNIVERSITY IN **PAKISTAN OPENS CHRISTIAN CHAPEL**

Karachi: For the first time in the history of Pakistan, a Christian chapel has been opened in an Islamic university. The church of St Mary, housed in the atrium of the Agriculture University of Faisalabad, was inaugurated on 15th April by Joseph Arshad, Archbishop of Islamabad-Rawalpindi. The new chapel is a novelty for the Muslimmajority country. Up until now, universities and colleges have only been allowed to build only Islamic mosques.



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
